Summery Greetings to all our readers

Tena koutou katoa. The recent rain has been welcome, filling up the tanks and hopefully recharging the aquifer underneath us, but the sunshine is pleasant too. Nights are getting warmer, and its tempting to start thinking of summer plans. But we have learnt, over the last couple of years, that our own expectations can't be relied upon. We know anything is possible.

Some good news to share: Work-teams from Chorus have begun a six-month long project to deliver Fibre technology across the Peninsula. See the next few pages for information about the project and the cultural induction offered to the Chorus team by Haititaimarangai Marae. **Please take extra care on our roads** as tamariki are returning to school / Kura. Remember to

slow down to 20km when passing a stationary school bus. Please also be aware of tamariki waiting at bus stops. New speed restrictions are now in force on some sections of State Highway Ten. Page four has details.

Important reminders: There is a 30k speed-limit on Tokerau Beach. Please respect other users on the beach when you are driving your vehicle. **All** sand-dunes are off-limits for **all** vehicles. To those who enjoy windsurfing and other water-related sports, please make sure you provide a safe experience for swimmers and other beach users.

Fireworks: The lighting of fireworks anywhere on Karikari Peninsula is prohibited. Please tell your guests and visitors when they arrive. Since this ban came into force several years ago there have been less callouts for our brigades over the Guy Fawkes and New Year periods. **Karikari Community Library** will be reopening on Thursday 28 October, with the usual hours; 10am—1pm. Librarian Ere Page is keen to increase the library's patronage. To this end, she wonders if there are others who would like to volunteer to operate the library—on a roster system. Welcome and induction for Ventia and Chorus team on the Karikari Peninsula: Nau mai haere mai ki te takiwā o Te Whānau Moana me Te Rorohuri.

Haititaimarangai Marae Cultural Advisor Nina Raharuhi, welcomed the team from Ventia and Chorus who will be installing fibre optic cable to the Peninsula. Rev Robert Urlich also joined the welcome and gave a summary of some historical points of interest, and reminded listeners that they are all one people under one creator. Thomson Lawrence added that he knows plenty of good workers if more are needed.

Ms Raharuhi gave a cultural induction so team members were aware of particular cultural places of interest, and the role tangata whenua have as Kaitiaki in this place. There was opportunity for questions, enabling a better un-

derstanding of how Chorus will be carrying out this work. There will be an archeologist advisor available if historical or cultural artifacts are discovered.

Karakia was performed at the first site along Bay Heights Drive before grounds were broken.

Please make the team feel welcome as they carry out their work across the peninsula.

What does the Fibre Network Rollout mean for you?

Fibre, also referred to in New Zealand as Ultra-Fast Broadband (UFB) uses fibre optic cable to deliver your broadband connection. Fibre provides faster, more reliable broadband to your home than traditional copper lines, and enables you to connect to many products and services.

The Karikari Peninsula is one of the Specified fibre areas (SFAs) where Chorus will eventually be able to stop providing copper-based phone and internet services, because fibre is available. Chorus will be installing fibre at no cost under the code. However, the company you choose to supply your phone or broadband services with may charge additional costs. It is worth shopping around for the best deal for you. The Copper Withdrawal Code sets out the minimum requirements Chorus, the provider of New Zealand's copper telecommunications network, must meet before it can stop providing wholesale copper phone and broadband service.

The Chorus team will be in our area for at least six months to complete this project. The map shows which areas of the peninsula will be covered and in which order. You will see the team mark out services first, and then drill and trench down each road to install the infrastructure. On boundaries you will see marker pegs (green sticks); each one of these will service two houses. Top Energy will also be working with the team.

If your home is down a right of way or on a private road, provision will be made for the customers, however further installation may be at your cost.

Ventia/Chorus COVID Protocols/Guidelines

Chorus is building an Ultrafast Broadband fibre network in Whatuwhiwhi, beginning in October. Once completed, the new network will bring a much faster internet service to the town.

This work is due for completion in April 2022, and will involve drilling and excavations in footpaths and berms. Any ground affected will be reinstated to acceptable council standards.

As well as the main network cable running along the road reserve, the team will also install smaller connections lines from the main cable to each property's boundary.

Our teams are from the Far North, and will be strictly following all health protocols to prevent the spread of Covid, and you can feel assured that safety for our crews and communities is our highest priority. Please help us by making sure you observe distancing when you pass the work sites.

- Sick workers are to stay home
- Social distance and mask wearing to be practiced on site

• The team will not be mixing with the community, and only one crew member will be collecting supplies from local shops to minimise risk.

• Extensive record keeping to enable traceability

There is no need for the crew to be dealing with the public, or entering private property. Any public queries should be directed to Matt Robertson, stakeholder and community rep for Ventia on 027 886 1905, or Matt.robertson@visionstream.co.nz.

Monitors and archaeologists should try to keep a 2m distance – this won't be easy but it is doable. The document also covers the protocols for our teams that work with homeowners to connect to the network (a separate project), hence it talks about going onto peoples property – this is not part of this project.

The crews to be used are from the North, and the archaeologist, Doug Gaylard, has been vaccinated. Cultural Monitor/Advisor Nina Raharuhi (tangata whenua) will be onsite at all times while works are carried out. Nina has also been fully vaccinated.

Once the main network across the township has been completed, then the process of connecting properties to the network can begin, so residents could be enjoying ultrafast broadband for work and play. For most properties connecting to the network will be free.

Changes to Speed Limits on State Highway 10

From 22 October 2021, the permanent new speed limits are:

SH10: Existing 100km/h area from 455m southwest of Pukewhai Road to 610m northeast of Duncan Road – 80km/h

SH10: Existing 100km/h area through Kaingaroa from 610m northeast of Duncan Road to 360m southwest of Duncan Road – 60km/h

SH10: Existing 100km/h area from 360m southwest of Duncan Road to 1.480km southwest of Pairatahi Road – 80km/h

SH10: Existing 100km/h area through Kareponia from 1.480km southwest of Pairatahi Road to 1.275km northeast of Godinovich Road – 60km/h

SH10: Existing 100km/h area from 1.275km northeast of Godinovich Road to 430m west of Kumi Road – 80km/h

Awanui to Kaingaroa

SH10: Extending the existing 50km/h area by 190m east of Awanui, from 430m west of Kumi Road to SH10/SH1 intersection – 50km/h

Let's hope this change will be respected by drivers and our roads become safer for all users.

Tuatua Tavern Open For Business.

It's great seeing the Tuatua Tavern open for business once more. Back in the day when the building opposite was a back-packer hostel, tourists would often wander over for a beer with friendly locals. While the visitors these days are from much closer to home, the little bar is still an ideal place to meet up, have a drink and set the world to rights.

Publican Pam, daughter of former Whatuwhiwhi residents Maureen and the late Ross Fisher, is one of those enviable people who manage to cram well over twenty four hours worth of living in each and every day.

Well known for her famous food caravan at Far North market and event days, Pam now has it parked up outside the tavern every evening. Her seafood chowder is second to none, the nachos and pork belly rolls are very popular and I can personally vouch for the hamburgers. Meals can be brought into the bar to enjoy with a beverage.

Food Caravan hours are roughly 5 to 9 pm every night.



Six years ago Pam decided she'd had enough of merely watching the stock car racing at Taipa from her food caravan window. Driving a little Honda CRX she took to the track and in 2019 had her first big win, coming away with the Percy Poharama Trophy. Cyclone Pam loves the adrenalin rush racing provides, these days in a trusty Honda Prelude.

Over the past thirty five years up to sixty foster children have been part of Pam's loving family; two - young adults now - still live with her.

From her home-gym she also finds time to train three times a week. In her second year of power-lifting she placed first in her age group at the Nationals.

Currently Nin and Pam run the bar; Kiri, Chris and Gina between them, handle the food caravan, courtesy van and Covid check-in. The courtesy van operates everyday for pick-ups and drop-offs and is well used. Pam says the range of service is not limited to the peninsula.

Tavern opening hours are 4 pm to midnight Mon to Fri with an 11 am opening Sat and Sun.

Operating any business under Covid restrictions comes with its own challenges. Once she gets the 'green light' Pam is keen to continue with the weekly members' draw and raffles, and the tavern has always sup-



ported the local fishing club and darts team. She is open to hosting karaoke nights and would welcome teams back if a keen quizmaster stepped up to run Trivia.

People from all walks of life visit this delightful little establishment. There are the retired regulars, the after-work mates, and the 'occasionals,' and if someone comes in without knowing a soul, they definitely don't leave that way.

CCTV Project Report

With the CCTV system now up and running for the past 12 months we have reviewed the project and operations for this period and provide the following comments.

Firstly, we have been advised by the police that reported incidents on the Karikari Peninsula area during the last three month period December-February were 80% down from the same period the year before, prior to the installation of the cameras. First Response Teams have also noticed a reduction for their services in the area.

This trend has continued for the year to date.

Process for Accessing CCTV Footage:

1. Lodge an incident report with the Police on the Crime Reporting Line: 105

2. Send an email to cameras@buildingsafercommunities.co.nz with the following information:

- Your name
- Address
- Incident number (from Police)
- Your contact details
- Incident date and approx timeframes

- Brief explanation of incident and what you want them to look for.

3. The CCTV monitoring team (Based at Kaitaia Police Station), will respond to your query and begin the search. This may take up to 3-4 business days due to workload.

4. The CCTV Team will respond with outcomes and if applicable will provide footage/ images to police to accompany the file. Footage will be provided on a case-by-case basis. The Team must adhere to privacy policies and procedures and must ensure all information is provided in the strictest of confidence.

A number of small adjustments will be made in the next month to update the system which will also provide access for the national police network.

Our service providers have recommended that the installation of another two cameras be considered to provide comprehensive cover for the Tokerau Beach and Whatuwhiwhi area. Further fund-raising will be required to achieve this outcome and cover the annual operational costs.

Thanks to those who have committed to a regular direct payment for the project.

Congratulations to Local Firefighters

It was a while ago now, but its still not too late to congratulate the team at Rangiputa Rural Fire Force who were recipients at their Award Ceremony earlier this year.

A total of 94 years of service was recognised with a number of special medals and awards presented by Fire and Emergency New Zealand Muriwhenua Area Manager Wipari Henwood at the Karikari Community Hall. 
