Happy New Year; Xīnnián hǎo

Kia ora and a Happy New Year to all residents and visitors to Karikari Peninsula. A warm welcome to those who have recently arrived in this beautiful spot. Groups and activities will be commencing soon –there is something for everyone.

Cyclone Gabrielle looks like its heading our way. Nina Raharuhi from our local civil defence says "Civil Defence Northland have advised us to prepare as best we can for the upcoming cyclone. The focus now is yourselves, whanau and our community to prepare . Stock up on necessities including medications and fuelling/filling your vehicles if in a position to do so. Allow for at least 5 days of being without power." Stay updated through Civil Defence Northland Facebook, TV & radio.

Chinese New Year 2023 is a **Year of the Rabbit**, more specifically, Water Rabbit, starting from January 22nd, 2023, and lasting until February 9th, 2024. When people meet friends, relatives, colleagues, and even strangers during the festive period, they usually say "Xīnnián hǎo" literally meaning 'New Year Goodness', or "Xīnnián kuàilè" meaning 'Happy Chinese New Year'.

A message from the Rural Fire Force: It's with huge relief that we are this far through the holiday season and no major call-outs like we experienced the last two years. I put this down to all our local residents sharing with visitors the importance of the fireworks ban and permitted fires only. Certainly the wet weather played a part, but with windy conditions drying out fire-fuels after one or two days the fire risk was certainly there again. So thanks everyone for your support during our most dangerous time of the year. PS; conditions at the moment are heading towards high risk again so your awareness will be much appreciated.

Census Day is March 7

The census is a nationwide survey that happens every five years to understand more about life in New Zealand and how it is changing. Paper census forms will be available in a range of accessible formats, including a Large Print version that can be printed on demand. Information to help people complete the census will also be available in alternate formats such as New Zealand Sign Language, Braille-ready files, audio, and Easy Read.

Stats NZ will deliver instructions about how to do the 2023 Census to every place where people live or stay. Look out for these instructions from February 2023 and hopefully it will be more organised this time.





Karikari Panui

A cautionary tale

We've all seen the stories of people getting scammed. Just last week we read that a prominent entertainer had been fleeced of 100k in an elaborate investment hoax.

What I am about to share is small in comparison. However, the end result can be just as devastating for someone whose income and savings are smaller.

And it is not technically a scam, in that people do receive the product. But the way these companies go about selling their goods is deceitful. The reason for writing this is to warn other people from making the same mistake as I did... twice.

I bought both products from advertisements on Facebook. Both were supposedly Australian companies selling health products, in my case, to clean arteries and reduce cholesterol.

The ad started off with a believable blurb, peeking interest. They then offered the product at a heavily-reduced rate, in this case \$39 per bottle. That seemed OK and I proceeded to the next stage, which involved filling out the bankcard details. Now, in every other legitimate transaction, one is shown the amount one is paying and can then make the choice of whether to proceed through checkout. I assumed that would occur when I pushed 'next', bringing up a new page. Instead, they offered a further product which I didn't want. Not surprisingly, the 'not-now 'button didn't work, and there was no back option. I figured it was only another \$30, so I pushed 'buy'.

My advice to readers is to abandon the transaction before pushing this button. Once done, the transaction becomes complete with the buyer still not having been shown how much they have bought or the amount charged.

In my case, I thought I was buying one bottle of product and the second bottle of something else, totaling \$79.

Instead, I received an email to say I had purchased five bottles, costing \$212.

But it got even worse when I checked my bankcard to find a deduction of \$351. A further cost of \$71 for the second product was taken out the next day, totaling \$422.

There was also no mention anywhere of the currency being in US dollars. One would assume an Australian company would be dealing in Australian dollars. It appears that this is American driven, operating through an Australian base.

I tried to stop the order but was told it was already on its way, which was a lie because I received an email two days later to say it was now dispatched. I did, however, manage to get a deduction of \$200 on my order. I could have followed an elaborate return process once I received the product but I wasn't sure if I would ever get any refund if I did it this way.

The problem with this type of selling is that one is not told the currency. American dollars are nearly double NZ dollars. The buyer is not shown how much product has been purchased or the total cost of their transaction before it becomes complete. This is especially problematic because one thinks they are only partway through the process, as they would be in any other normal internet deal.

Why did I make the same mistake twice? That's a good question. I totally forgot about the first experience, not recalling it until I saw the deduction in my bank account, then it all came back. The companies were different but the method identical.

Process for Accessing CCTV Footage:

1. Lodge an incident report with the Police on the Crime Reporting Line: 105 ASAP

2. Send an email to cctvkarikari@gmail.com and contact northlandcctv.co.nz or 09 407 8788 with the following information ASAP:

- Your name
- Address
- Incident number (from Police)
- Your contact details
- Incident date and approx timeframes
- Brief explanation of incident and what you want them to look for.

3. The CCTV monitoring team will respond to your query and begin the search. This may take up to 3-4 business days due to workload.

4. The CCTV Team will respond with outcomes and if applicable will provide footage/ images to police to accompany the file. Footage will be provided on a case-by-case basis. The Team must adhere to privacy policies and procedures and must ensure all information is provided in the strictest of confidence.




