Greetings to our readers as we move into Autumn

Northland Fire and Emergency's Facebook page has announced the change of fire seasons for Northland. Most of Northland has returned to an open fire season as from 8am Friday 1 April. At the same time, the section of the Far North north of Awanui to Cape Reinga, and including Karikari Peninsula, moves to a **restricted season**.

"The significant rain across most of Northland over the last three weeks has lowered fire risks considerably," says Wipari Henwood, District Manager Northland, Fire and Emergency. North of Awanui to Cape Reinga, including Karikari Peninsula, had a number of large-scale wildfires this past summer, and the area has now reverted from prohibited to a restricted fire season. Permits are still required to light an open-air fire in a restricted fire season. Mr Henwood reminds everyone to be careful and check the weather conditions before lighting an open-air fire, whatever the fire season. For more information, fire safety tips and whether a permit is needed for a specific location, go to www.checkitsalright.nz.

Changes at local Civil Defence Response Group

Tony Gillespie who has been the local coordinator for the Karikari response group for a number of years has announced his retirement from the role. 'I am pleased with the many positive achievements we have made over recent years,' Mr Gillespie said. He numerated successes such as the installation of Tsunami directional signs, and safe location signs, additional alarms and the creation of the Rangiputa subgroup. 'I feel I leave the group in a strong position,' he said. Under Mr Gillespie's watch the group had to deal with the impact of very real tsunami warnings, threats from a major fire, and storms. Karikari Peninsula Residents and Ratepayers CCTV Project

Updates for March 2022

Information recently received from the CCTV Project indicates that burglaries reported on the Peninsula are at an eight year low.

Car theft is the lowest recorded over the last five years.

Theft is the lowest since 2011, and unique occurrences are also at an eight year low.

Much of the credit for this reduction in offenses across the peninsula can be given to the installation and monitoring of the CCTV cameras. Thank you to all who continue to support the project-there will be on -going costs for maintenance and increasing the range of cover.

Process for Accessing CCTV Footage:

1. Lodge an incident report with the Police on the Crime Reporting Line: 105 ASAP

2. Send an email to cctvkarikari@gmail.com and contact northlandcctv.co.nz or 09 407 8788 with the following information ASAP:

- Your name
- Address
- Incident number (from Police)
- Your contact details

- Incident date and approx timeframes

- Brief explanation of incident and what you want them to look for.

3. The CCTV monitoring team will respond to your query and begin the search. This may take up to 3-4 business days due to workload.

4. The CCTV Team will respond with outcomes and if applicable will provide footage/images to police to accompany the file. Footage will be provided on a case-by-case basis. The Team must adhere to privacy policies and procedures and must ensure all information is provided in the strictest of confidence.

To enable the Fire Brigade and other emergency services to reach your property:

Make sure your driveway is at least 4x4 metres wide.

Clearly signpost your rural property with its RAPID property number.

• Ensure there's an adequate water supply for fire and emergency services.

Let's not be wasteful; What to do with scraps of soap?

Everyone ends up with slivers of soap that make a mess, and aren't easy to use, right?

But they can be recycled, and there are a couple of simple methods to make sure you don't waste even one scrap of soap.

If you have some pieces of net curtaining you can sew up small bags. These can be used to collect those leftover bits of soap, and once wet will make a satisfying amount of rich soapy suds.

A second method is to grate dry soap—you need a fair amount to make this worthwhile. Once you have about a cup full of soapy bits, put it into the centre of a small clean cloth. Bring the corners together and twist to create a ball of soap within the cloth. Dip this several times into a pot of warm water—wearing gloves for this is a good idea. After each dip, squeeze the shape into a ball; this could take several goes. Once the soap has been melded into one ball, you can smooth it with a little of the now soapy water. When you are satisfied with the final shape, leave to dry for at least 24 hours before using. The third method requires using the stove top. Grate dry soap into a pot, add 1-2 teaspoons of water-to stop it burning, and with a little heat, stir until the soap melts sufficiently. Remove from the pot and press into a mold—leave 24 hours to dry, tip out, and then use. YouTube has a range of videos demonstrating these methods-so have a go and save some dollars.




