ANZAC DAY Service at Whatuwhiwhi



Farewell to Judy and Robin Billington

The community turned up with food, gifts, and well-wishes for Robin and Judy Billington as the couple prepared to leave the Peninsula for further adventures. They have lived at Tokerau Beach for some thirty years and have contributed to many aspects of community-life during that time.

Robin served many years as Fire Chief at the Rangiputa Rural Fire Force, and Judy as the Secretary. She has also been involved with the Karikari First Response Group - Civil Defence, served as President for the Karikari Community Hall Committee and on the Karikari Peninsula Residents and Ratepayers Association. One of the first speakers at the organised luncheon for the couple was Evan McKay who thanked them for their work, acknowledging they had big shoes to fill, and said they were always welcome to come back. Judy expressed that the Peninsula had always been special to her and she felt a spiritual affinity to the area. She used the opportunity to remind those gathered that involvement in community affairs and groups was the way to feel connection and a sense of belonging. "Get involved in the mahi, then you will know the community," she said. She also acknowledged that her work had been achieved by having the support of many others; "I couldn't have done it without you," she added, not letting the moment pass without a plug for the Residents and Ratepayers Association; "This group is our voice to the FNDC. Please support them to keep the Association going if you want things done on the Peninsula."

Robin Billington said he was encouraged by the young people who were stepping up in a variety of roles. He also thanked those who tended to be in the background, but gave support in other ways such as financially. He also thanked the community for attending and putting on this 'do' for them.

Gifts and flowers were presented to the couple on behalf of the Rangiputa Rural Fire Force by Vanessa Goodwin, Jo Armstrong and Raewyn Nixon. Terry Nixon praised Robin's mentorship, especially for the young ones coming through, saying this bodes well for the future of the team.

Jo Armstrong will be taking over the responsibility of day to day management of the Rangiputa team as second in command, with oversight from Coran Stephens.

Tony Gillespie thanked Judy for all the work she had done in the local Civil Defence group especially during times of difficulty. He also injected some light humour by thanking her for keeping him focused over the last twenty years, fixing the house she had sold him when she was working in real estate.

More thanks came from resident Bertha Yerkovich who expressed her gratitude for everything the Billingtons had done for the community, and Judy's friendship. Further acknowl-

edgments came from the Bowling Club, the Garden Club and other residents.







Process for Accessing CCTV Footage:

- 1. Lodge an incident report with the Police on the Crime Reporting Line: 105 ASAP
- 2. Send an email to cctvkarikari@gmail.com and contact northlandcctv.co.nz or 09 407 8788 with the following information ASAP:
- Your name
- Address
- Incident number (from Police)
- Your contact details
- Incident date and approx timeframes
- Brief explanation of incident and what you want them to look for.
- 3. The CCTV monitoring team will respond to your query and begin the search. This may take up to 3-4 business days due to workload.
- 4. The CCTV Team will respond with outcomes and if applicable will provide footage/images to police to accompany the file. Footage will be provided on a case-by-case basis. The Team must adhere to privacy policies and procedures and must ensure all information is provided in the strictest of confidence.


