Marine Life Safety

This Christmas / New Year period we have been blessed with marine mammals

Avoid this area

Slow speed (no-wake speed)

DOLPHINS

Avoid this area

50 m

Slow speed (no-wake speed)

WHALES

in the cetacean family frequenting the bay.

Both Orca and Bottlenose Dolphins have been in very close to shore. Facebook has been full of some amazing photos and video.

As always, it's important to remember the rules which are available on the DOC website. That being said, when the marine life come and crash your day at the beach, it's not always possible to follow the rules to the letter!

In summary don't do anything to harass or upset these magnificent creatures and be mindful that they don't always show distress clearly. If in doubt back away slowly.

Te whānau puha, ngā aihe me ngā kekeno – e mātaki ai i tai Whales, dolphins and seals

- sea-based viewing
- Ensure you travel no faster than idle or 'no wake' speed within 300 m
- Make sure there are no more than three vessels within 300 m
- Approach from a direction that is parallel and slightly to the rear. Do not circle the marine mammals, obstruct their path or cut through any groups
- Idle slowly away

Ngā aihe Dolphins

- Gradually increase speed to outdistance dolphins; do not exceed 10 kn until more than 300 m away
- · Do not swim with dolphin pods containing juveniles

Te whānau puha Whales (including orca and pilot whales)

- · Stay at least 50 m away from any whale
- Stay at least 200 m away from any baleen or sperm whale mother and calf
- · Do not swim with whales

Law Corner

Fences

Fences are a common source of disputes with neighbours. Most of the law relating to fences is contained in the <u>Fencing Act 1978</u>, which sets out the basic rules regarding fences.

Importantly property owners can enter into private agreements about fencing matters. These agreements can be registered against the titles of the land subject to the agreement so that subsequent owners will be bound for up to 12 years after registration of the agreement.

Unless there is an agreement that applies the Fencing Act provides that:

- neighbours must pay for the fence in equal shares
- the middle of a fence must be on the boundary line, although there is provision for give and take where the true boundary is difficult to fence
- if a fence is damaged the neighbour who damages the fence is liable for the cost of repair

Where neighbours can't reach agreement about a fence the Fencing Act sets out a dispute mechanism, which will be outlined in the next Panui.



Garlic butter Chicken Maryland

Maryland is called a Chicken Leg quarter and in the UK it is called a chicken leg. Whatever you call it, this cut of meat is cost effective and very hard to overcook.

Ingredients (to serve 4 to 6 people)

- 100gm butter softened
- 6 cloves garlic minced
- 4 tsp fresh herbs or 2 tsp dried herbs
- salt
- 4 chicken Marylands skin on
- pepper
- 1/3c white wine, chicken or vegetable stock or water (the liquid)

Method

- turn the oven on to 200 degrees Celsius fan bake, or 220 degrees if you don't have a fan bake option
- mix the garlic, herbs and 1/2 tsp of salt
- gently separate the skin from the chicken on the leg part and spread / push almost a quarter of the butter mix under the skin of each piece as far as you can go. Rub the remaining butter mix over each piece.
- put the chicken in a baking dish
- sprinkle over 1/4 tsp salt and a grind of pepper
- add your choice of liquid
- put in the oven and roast with lid off for 10 minutes
- put the lid on (or cover with foil if the dish does not have a lid), lower the temperature to 180 degrees Celsius fan bake, or 200 degrees Celsius if no fan and cook for 40 minutes
- pierce the fattest piece of chicken with a sharp knife juices should be clear if not, bake for a further 5 minutes and check again and repeat until cooked
- rest for 5 minutes and serve.

Comments

For 2 to 3 people, halve the garlic, herbs and butter, everything else stays the same.

If you have some vegetables that are getting past their best, you can throw these in before you put the chicken in the baking dish.


Great served with mashed potato and green beans, lettuce salad or bean salad.

 - 2. Send an email to cctvkarikari@gmail.com and contact northlandcctv.co.nz or 09 407 8788 with the following information ASAP:




Incident date and approx. timeframes, Brief explanation of incident and what you want them to look for.

- 3. The CCTV monitoring team will respond to your query and begin the search. This may take up to 3-4 business days due to workload.
- 4. The CCTV Team will respond with outcomes and if applicable will provide footage/images to police to accompany the file. Footage will be provided on a case-by-case basis. The Team must adhere to privacy policies and procedures and must ensure all information is provided in the strictest of confidence.


