

Te Whānau Moana me Te Rorohuri Nga Hapu

Pānui ā-Hapū

Nā Te Whānau Moana me Te Rorohuri

Tēnā koutou, nau mai, haere mai ki te rohe o Te Whānau Moana me Te Rorohuri i te pae whenua o Karikari.

Our hapū trust you will enjoy your time here on the Karikari Peninsula. Our hapū and wider community work tirelessly to care for and protect our rohe, and we ask for the support of both residents and visitors. By sharing this information, we hope to ensure these taonga are respected, protected, and preserved for future generations.

AUKATI AHI – TOTAL FIRE BAN There is a total fire ban across the entire Karikari Peninsula. This includes all fires and fireworks throughout the summer months, until the ban is officially lifted. Please stay up to date via the Karikari Facebook Community Pages.

NGĀ TĀHUNA ONEONE – SAND DUNES AND BEACHES The beaches of Pātia, Perehipe, Tokerau, Maitai, Pūheke, Karikari, Rangiputa, and Tuitonga all contain sand dunes that are actively protected and respected by our hapū.

ALL sand dunes across the peninsula are wāhi tapu. They hold the kōiwi of our tūpuna and are therefore sacred. These dunes are also home to native flora and fauna, including nesting shore birds. Please keep your distance at all times—especially with dogs.

Our hapū are currently undertaking dune restoration and replanting projects.

- ALL vehicles are strictly prohibited on dunes
- No metal detecting or digging – this is unsafe and risks collapse, especially for children
- Remain on marked dune tracks only
- Walk with care and respect, as you would for your own whānau.

Where vehicle access is permitted on Tokerau Beach, all drivers must travel at low speed, obey the posted speed limits, and drive with extreme care. Dangerous driving, racing, burnouts, doughnuts, or reckless behaviour are strictly prohibited. Vehicles must give way to pedestrians, whānau, children, and wildlife at all times. Unsafe driving puts lives, wāhi tapu, and kai moana at risk and will be reported. If you witness vehicles driving on dunes or unsafe behaviour on the beach, please call 105 to report it or 111 if threatened, Photos or videos with vehicle registration details are very helpful. (Alternatively, information may be shared via the Karikari Facebook Community Pages or directly with the relevant trust/hapū representatives.) Vehicles also damage tuatua and pipi beds between the low tide mark and the dunes by crushing their growth cycle. Please help us protect these taonga by walking along the beach rather than driving where possible.

PŪWHEKE ME TE AHU MAUNGA Walking access to the top only, no vehicles, park at the base, no camping, or fires permitted, there are no toilet facilities, so please plan ahead.

Vehicles are prohibited on Pūheke Beach under Northland Regional Council regulations, and infringements may result in fines. Please continue to protect tuatua beds by keeping vehicles off the beach and walking instead.

NGĀ ARA – TRACKS AND TRAILS Please remain on marked tracks and trails. This ensures your safety and protects sensitive habitats.

If you encounter a gate unlocked, locked closed or not it indicates private land—please do not enter.

HAITITAIMARANGAI MARAE Please respect our marae. Do not enter marae grounds unless accompanied by a hapū member. Roads passing our marae are private roads.

TŌPUNI – CAMPING & FREEDOM CAMPING DOC campsite: Maitai Bay, Freedom camping site: Tokerau Beach (entry off Inland Road on to Ramp Road). For current rules and conditions, please refer to the FNDC website and Doc who are meant to be monitoring the Freedom camp site.

IF THERE IS NO SIGNAGE, CAMPING IS NOT PERMITTED.

TE HĪ ME TE KOHI KAI MOANA – FISHING & SHELLFISH GATHERING Rāhui is a Māori customary practice placing temporary restrictions on areas or resources to allow the mauri to recover, or due to an area being tapu (your safety).

There is no gathering or fishing of any kai moana in Maitai Bay. This rāhui is in place to allow depleted stocks to replenish.

Boats and yachts anchoring within the bay are not welcomed by local whānau, and visitors are asked to respect this tikanga.

WHAKAKŌRIPI IKA – FILLETING FISH Please dispose of fish remains and shellfish—especially kina shells—with respect. Do not leave bones or shells on the beach, sand, grass, or in the sea, fillet fish on land only, bury remains in soil (not sand), compost them, or gift them.

Fish bones are often used for food—posting on the Karikari Facebook Community Page will usually result in someone gratefully collecting them. Kai moana are taonga and gifts—please do not waste them.

CAULERPA If you are diving or boating, please be vigilant for invasive Caulerpa seaweed, currently present in the Bay of Islands. Check and clean anchors and equipment before entering any moana, If you suspect Caulerpa, do not disturb or spread it, Record the location and take photos if possible.

ROTOPOTAKA – LAKE ROTOPOTAKA No chemicals, detergents, or shampoos in the lake, these pollute the water and cause algal growth. No camping permitted, no restroom here plan your trip wisely- take your trash with you!

WAKA, JET SKI ME NGĀ POTI All boats and jet skis must travel at 5 knots (walking pace) when within 200 metres off shore.

Please keep clear of swimmers and adhere to speed limits at all times.

PARA – RUBBISH Please take all rubbish with you when you leave. A refuse and recycling station is located on Inland Road.

We wish you a safe, enjoyable, and respectful visit to our rohe. Ngā mihi nui for caring for our place alongside us.

How about some history of the area...



When Captain Cook mapped out Doubtless Bay what we now know as Knuckle Point was referred to as Knockle Point. Although precisely what he was referring to is not entirely clear. As noted in the relevant footnote in *Voyage of the Endeavour* (Northernmost New Zealand) "this has been identified with Cape Karikari. But Cape Karikari is the north-east point of this peninsula, and according to the chart ... Cook applied the name to the south-east point ..."

Process for Accessing CCTV Footage:

1. An incident report with the Police on the Crime Reporting Line: 105 ASAP
2. An email to cctvkarikari@gmail.com and contact northlandcctv.co.nz or 09 407 8788 with the following information ASAP:
 - **Your name, Address, Incident number (from Police), Your contact details**
 - **Incident date and approx. timeframes, Brief explanation of incident and what you want them to look for.**
3. CCTV monitoring team will respond to your query and begin the search. This may take up to 3-4 business days due to workload.
4. CCTV Team will respond with outcomes and if applicable will provide footage/images to police to accompany the file. Footage will be provided on a case-by-case basis. The Team must adhere to privacy policies and procedures and must ensure all information is provided in the strictest of confidence.

Law Corner

Locally inspired recipe

Agreements for sale and purchase

The most commonly used agreement for sale and purchase (ASP) of land is the version prepared by The Law Association of New Zealand Incorporated (TLANZ). This AP is regularly up-dated and the new Eleventh Edition was released on 21 April 2026.

While it is not necessary to use the TLANZ ASP, the advantage of using this is that your estate agent and lawyer will likely be very familiar with the standard terms of the ASP, which have been developed and up-dated over time to address issues that have been identified in previous transactions and changes in law. The key additions and amendments in the 11th edition include:

- new vendor warranties that provide that any "automatic garage door facility" is in reasonable working order
- that any "restricted building work" (as defined in the Building Act 2004) done on the property on or after 13 March 2012 was carried out or supervised by a "suitably qualified person"
- an amended finance condition so that a purchaser who cannot satisfy the finance condition is only required to provide a "reasonable" explanation of the "steps taken" to arrange finance. The new wording is intended to provide a fairer more objective standard
- the vendor is now required to "take reasonable steps" to enable a purchaser to fulfil an Overseas Investment Act consent condition where this condition applies
- wider options for claims of compensation, previously a purchaser could only make a single claim. However, any claims must be made by the last working day before settlement
- a new Information Privacy Principle to reflect the amendments to the Privacy Act 2020 that apply from 1 May 2026

The 11th edition of the ASP also includes a new warranty from both purchaser and vendor that the standard text in the ASP has not been altered, removed, or added to in a way that is not "reasonably identifiable".

Regardless of the form used for an ASP it is essential that you understand how the terms in the ASP apply to you. If you have any questions about an ASP, or any other legal matter (excluding traffic and criminal) the next Koha Legal Clinic will be held on the 4th of July 2026 at the Karekare Community Centre between 9am and 10.30am. Simple Fish Dish

It doesn't get much easier than this!

Fresh locally caught fish, served with fried shallots, spring onion, a squeeze of lemon juice and chipotle mayo.

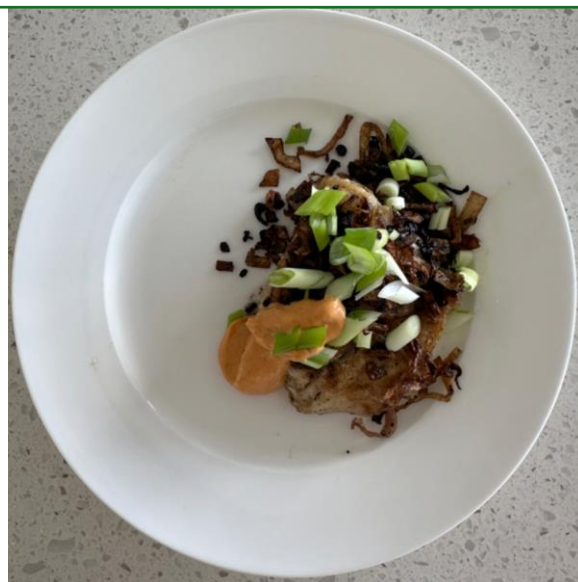
Ingredients per serve

- fish fillet dredged in flour
- 1 shallot - sliced about 3mm thick
- 1/3 spring onion - sliced about 4mm thick
- 1T butter
- 1 tsp oil
- 1T oil
- squeeze of lemon juice
- mayonnaise of choice (the recipe for chipotle mayo will be in the next Panui)

Method

Melt the butter and pan fry the fish fillet in the butter and 1 tsp of oil. While you are doing this, pan fry the shallots until a deep brown in the remaining oil. Take off the heat immediately and put on a paper towel to drain off any excess oil. Shallots go from delicious to bitter very quickly if left in the pan too long. The fried shallots in the photo below were my second attempt!

When the fish fillet is cooked, drain off any excess butter on a paper towel. Put on the plate, add a squeeze of lemon juice, sprinkle over the shallots and the spring onion. Finish with a dollop of mayonnaise.

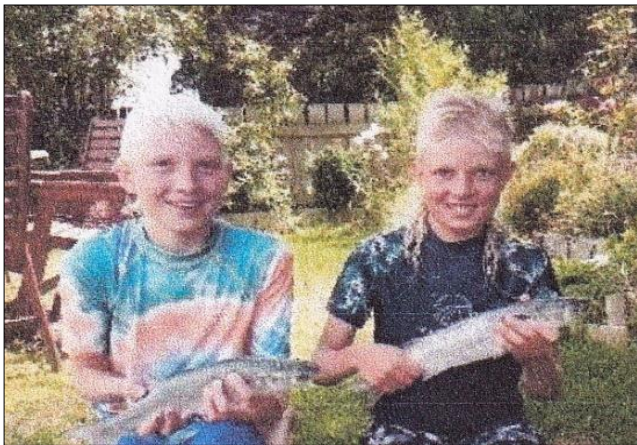
